


1 THESSALONIANS: FAITH. LOVE. HOPE.

Getting Started

- **Big Idea:** No matter what we experience we can rejoice that Jesus will return and make all things right.
- Starter Activity:

Story/Scripture

At the end of Paul's letter to the Thessalonian church, he had a few more things he wanted to make sure they knew. He wanted them to respect and appreciate their leaders who were continuing to lead them to Jesus. He wanted them to be patient with one another; to warn those who were lazy and not helping the community, to comfort those who were tired and discouraged, and to help those who were to weak to do it themselves. Most importantly, he wanted them to remember that no matter what was going on, they had a good reason to rejoice always, to pray constantly, and to be thankful in all circumstances. He said this was God's will for them, in Christ Jesus.

How could they rejoice and be thankful when so many people were being mean and even hurting them for following Jesus? Paul reminded them to hold onto God's word and stay connected to God's Spirit. Remember the True Story! And remember that Jesus is coming back! The work God started in you and in the world - He is faithful to finish it!

If you are in Christ, then no matter what circumstance you are in you have God's Spirit with you, you have Jesus' righteousness and peace with you, and you have God's love inside you. That means no matter what, you have a lot to be thankful for and to rejoice in. This is what it means to pray constantly - to always be aware that God is present with you. So remember, Jesus is coming back to make all things right and good. Rejoice!

[Dialogue Questions - suggestions for families to discuss]

- What do you think it means to rejoice? Is this different from just being happy?
- o What reasons do you have to rejoice in life right now?
- What are some ways you can show that you are thankful for what God has done in the world?

BLESS Activity:

For kids to do during the week

Because this Story is true, we want to be faithful to live in it. We ask the Spirit to help us to *Bless, Listen, Eat, Speak*, and *Sabbath* (rest & celebrate) in ways that tell the good news of God's Story.

This week, focus on the **Listen** rhythm.

Praying constantly means we are always aware that the Spirit of God is with us and we can listen to Him at all times. Take some special time this week to sit quietly and listen to God. Ask Him to speak to you.
